## **Creation Museum President Ken Ham Offers Rebuttal to Bill Nye’s Anti-Creationist Video**

**Answers in Genesis and Creation Museum founder says teachings in  
Genesis give children purpose and meaning in life**

**WHAT:** Bill Nye, well-known for his popular PBS-TV program “Bill Nye the Science Guy,” recently released an anti-creationist video, which has gone viral. In the video, Nye continues a recent tactic employed by many evolutionists in their battle against creationists (one that is especially used by Richard Dawkins): to employ an *ad hominem* argument—that creationists are committing a form of “[child abuse](#)” when they teach creation to children.

Through the Creation Museum and its own resources, Answers in Genesis (AiG), a biblical apologetics ministry, teaches children and adults the truth concerning who they are in the Creator’s eyes—and where they came from.

**WHO:** Ken Ham, president and founder of the biblical apologetics ministry AiG and the highly popular Creation Museum, can offer a rebuttal to Nye’s recent anti-creationist video. Ham is one of the most in-demand Christian speakers in North America. Author of numerous books on the accuracy and authority of the Bible, dinosaurs, and the destructive fruits of evolutionary thinking, Ham appears frequently on American TV, including Fox’s “The O’Reilly Factor” and “Fox and Friends,” CNN’s “The Situation Room with Wolf Blitzer” and ABC’s “Good Morning America.”
