Dr. Jason Lisle Speaker and Researcher



Dr. Jason Lisle is a practicing astronomer and astrophysicist, who also serves as a speaker and researcher for Answers in Genesis (AiG). His planetarium programs at the Creation Museum will reveal how physical scientific evidence refutes evolutionary accounts of origins, such as the “big-bang theory” or a universe billions of-years-old.

Dr. Lisle graduated summa cum laude from Ohio Wesleyan University with a double-major in physics and astronomy, along with a minor in mathematics. He later did graduate work at the University of Colorado, where he earned a Master’s degree and a Ph.D. in Astrophysics.

Using the Solar and Heliospheric Observatory (SOHO) spacecraft to investigate motions on the surface of the sun as well as solar magnetism and subsurface weather, Dr. Lisle completed his thesis entitled, “Probing the Dynamics of Solar Supergranulation and its Interaction with Magnetism.” He has also authored a number of papers in both secular and creationist literature.

At the university level, Dr. Lisle discovered an important element in scientific study regarding drawing conclusions from scientific evidence. His findings revealed that scientists interpret evidence based on their personal worldviews.

As a result, Dr. Lisle came to understand how intelligent scientists disagree on the interpretation of evidence when they have different starting points (i.e. belief in the authority of Scripture or not). So, as he read creation materials, Dr. Lisle observed that scientific evidence viewed through the lens of Scripture always supported the biblical account of creation.

Dr. Lisle developed a passion to share the message that God’s Word is true from the very first verse and is now helping AiG (and the creation movement as a whole) using his strong science background.

Dr. Lisle is not the stereotypical research scientist who has difficulty communicating at a layman’s level. In addition to his talks on astronomy, he has developed an excellent, well-illustrated address on the topic of “The Relevance of Genesis.”

Dr. Lisle, who is single, grew up in central Ohio. And yes, as an astrophysicist, he is a fan of the various “Star Trek” programs (although he grimaces at the occasional evolutionary content).
