The Creation Museum in Petersburg, the Grand Canyon Skywalk and New York City's New Museum of Contemporary Art have what in common?

They all made the list of "12 Most Intriguing New Things for 2007," selected by the Web site [sixnewthings.com](http://sixnewthings.com).

The Dallas-based Web site identifies six new things in 70 selected cities each month, highlighting everything from restaurants and roller coasters to architecture and theater.

The "Most Intriguing" list is an annual offering of some of the most eye-popping debuts ahead.

The Creation Museum, scheduled to open this spring, has stirred international controversy with its goal to debunk evolution and show the Bible as the true history of the world.

So what else made the list?

**The Grand Canyon Skywalk** - a horseshoe-shaped, glass enclosed, walkway extending 70 feet over the canyon's rim in Arizona.

**Rosewood Mayakoba**, a resort on Mexico's Riviera Maya opening in September, featuring suites, villas and a spa on individual islands.

**New York City's New Museum of Contemporary Art**, opening in the Bowery with a gravity-defying design.

**Colborne Lane**, a new Toronto restaurant for Claudio Aprile, who is the closest thing to a culinary rock star.

**Shakespeare in Washington** - a six-month tribute featuring programs by 60 arts organizations in the Washington, D.C. area.

**"A Waitress in Yellowstone,"** the first musical by legendary playwright David Mamet, premiering this summer in the Los Angeles area.

**Las Vegas Springs Preserve**, a 180-acre tribute to sustainability, with "green" museums, botanical gardens, trails and concert spaces, opening this summer.

**Olympic Sculpture Park** on the Seattle waterfront, a project of the Seattle Art Museum that transformed a former industrial brownfield.

**Kansas City, Mo.** - yes, the whole city, which is opening a new sports arena, college basketball hall of fame, advertising icon museum, expanding its Nelson-Adkins Museum and creating a nine-block development project in downtown.

**Victory Media Network** in Dallas, which will open in March as the first large outdoor digital arts gallery to use high-definition screens on movable tracks.

**Manchester International Festival** in Manchester, England, opening this summer, billed as the first international festival of original new work.
